## Dear Resident/Homeowner:

The City of St. Petersburg provides effective public services that enhance the quality of life in St. Petersburg. As part of this community-based mission, the Water Resources Department will be replacing the reclaimed water services in your neighborhood as the pilot project for the reclaimed water meter program. This first-of-its-kind program for the city is expected to show no initial difference in the cost of the utility for the customer.

Construction for this project is tentatively set to begin the week of January 15, 2022, and will last approximately six months.

The area of the construction will be in the Harbor Isle neighborhood, see the enclosed map for more detail. As a result of this construction, it will be necessary to interrupt your reclaimed water service for short periods during the day. The reclaimed water will be turned on at the end of the workday, everyday crews are in the area.

Interruptions will be held to the minimum. We are sorry for this temporary inconvenience and thank you for your cooperation.

What to expect during this timeframe:

- A new purple cover box with a new reclaimed water meter.
- Multiple Water Resources work crews will be digging in the public right-of-way to remove the existing service and box and install a new reclaimed water meter and box.
- Crews will disconnect and reconnect the reclaimed water service for all existing customers.
- We will do our best to keep the work areas to a minimum and perform restoration daily and replace sod as soon as it is available if it is needed.
- The shutdown of the reclaimed water will only be during the day and service restored before work crews leave the worksite nightly.
